## RECTOR'S LETTER

### REPAIRS TO THE CHURCH

There is certainly visible progress being made in the repairing and restoration work to the Church. Thanks to the pews in the Church being removed for storage and refurbishment, we have been able to move the Sunday services to the St Augustine's Chapel. There will, however, be a few Sundays when we will need to return to the Hall while the Chapel is painted and the floors sanded.

A constructive meeting was held in March with the assessor, contractor and sub-contractors, myself, Graham Muller, Phillip Everitt, Derek Harverson and Shirley Balladon, to discuss the repairs, time frame and the excess amount. The current repair bill is R2.2 million. The excess has not yet been fully determined.

While I think the time frame given by the contractor is a bit too optimistic i.e. end of May, it appears it will be later than that. However, our patience will be rewarded with a fine new beautiful Church.

### LENTEN APPEAL

Thank you to everyone for your support for the Lenten appeal for the restoration, repair and refurbishment of the chapel at St Martin's Children's Home. If you have not yet returned your donation, please do so by Good Friday.

### RHUMBELOW THEATRE

6.00 p.m. The Service of Light

The climax is Easter Sunday, from death to life, from despair to hope, from grief and sorrow to joy and celebration.

7.00 a.m. Mass

9.00 a.m. Sung Mass

## **EASTER OFFERING**

## **THE PARISH FETE**

On 29 June, is less than three months away! The Fete is a wonderful social community event that raises funds for our Specific Funds to cover major expenses that we are unable to pay for from the normal course of our contributions to the Parish.

We have a few challenges this year, with a number of people away. Please phone the Parish Office or speak to me or our Parish Secretary, Edith, if you can help with the following:

- To assist at the Tea Garden for an hour or two.
- We do not have a Curry Den - either to run the Curry Den or to cater for some other suitable meal.
- The Raffles, both the main one and liquor hampers need people to run them on the day of the Fete.

- Volunteers are required to mark the books prior to the Fete and help is required on the day.
- Bakers and Preserves are needed to supply for the Cake and Preserve Stalls.
- Tombola requires items for their stall i.e. non-perishables, children's interest etc.
- White Elephant, Books, Jewellery, Jumble etc. can be brought to the Parish Office, Church on Sundays or collected if you phone the Parish Office.
- Prizes are required for the main raffle and donations of wine and spirits for the liquor hampers.

Your support is needed and appreciated.

### **PRAYER IS LIFE CHANGING**

It is difficult to be positive, to be happy, to feel secure and safe and to have hope in the current climate in South Africa. I am acutely aware of the negative impact this has on my thoughts, words and feelings.

The revelations of state capture, nepotism and corrupt manipulation that has affected every South African through higher prices, particularly for electricity, water, sewage, rates, vat, fuel, basic food, together with poor service delivery, incompetent service, let alone the horrific levels of crime etc. etc.!! South Africa is currently experiencing its highest level of emigration. On top of this we have the election a month away with shocking rhetoric that is destructive, polarising and misleading.

The issue for the Church, for Christians and ourselves is, while we cannot, not, react to the above we must not allow it to change and control us to the point of despair and hopelessness. We have a faith, we believe in Christ Our Lord and Saviour. In the midst of all this we must continue to care, to show compassion and to express our faith in God. The best way to release the negative and to be immersed in the presence of God is through prayer. Prayer is life changing.
